2012 Cadence Taptail Bordeaux Red Blend Red Mountain (\$41.99)

“The nose opens with cherries and dust, completely evocative of the vineyard on a warm harvest afternoon. There is beautiful deep berry intensity on the palate. This leads to the supplest Taptail tannins I’ve tasted in a long time with a quiet acidity and a powerful finish that doesn’t stop. 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Cabernet Franc and 19% Merlot.” – Ben Smith, Winemaker.

2014 Cadence Coda Bordeaux Red Blend Red Mountain (\$25.99)

“The nose explodes with black cherry, black raspberry and spice that appear on the palate in waves of deep flavors. The fruit stays fresh and focused, buoyed by the natural acidity we kept by picking early. Coda’s exceptional depth and structure build through the long finish, ending with substantial fine tannins. 38% Cabernet Sauvignon, 33% Cabernet Franc, 20% Merlot, 9% Petit Verdot.” – Ben Smith, Winemaker.

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Red Wines

2012 Cadence Taptail Bordeaux Red Blend Red Mountain \$49.99/\$41.99/\$37.79

“The nose opens with cherries and dust, completely evocative of the vineyard on a warm harvest afternoon. There is beautiful deep berry intensity on the palate. This leads to the supplest Taptail tannins I’ve tasted in a long time with a quiet acidity and a powerful finish that doesn’t stop. 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Cabernet Franc and 19% Merlot.” —Ben Smith, Winemaker. **New vintage.**

2013 Gramercy Lower East Syrah Columbia Valley \$36.99/\$27.99/\$25.19

“The aromas bring immediate appeal, with notes of brown stems, herbs, crushed flowers, smoked meat and black pepper. The flavors don’t disappoint, showing purity, focus and generosity with a spot-on sense of balance and a lengthy finish that kicks it up a notch. Give it time to open up. Editors’ Choice.” –Sean Sullivan, 93 points. **New item.**

2012 Vinchio & Vaglio Serra Barbaresco Piedmont \$29.99/\$26.69/\$24.02

“Aromas of violets and tobacco. Fruity with tannic-long finish. When young, it has a warm and caressing taste. 100% Nebbiolo. The Nebbiolo, surely the most prestigious and aristocratic variety of Italy, is cultivated in Piedmont from centuries, only on the foothills of the Barbaresco, Treiso and Neive districts where the ground is particularly rich of organics substances.” –Winery notes. **New vintage.**

2014 Cadence Coda Bordeaux Red Blend Red Mountain \$28.99/\$25.99/\$23.39

“The nose explodes with black cherry, black raspberry and spice that appear on the palate in waves of deep flavors. The fruit stays fresh and focused, buoyed by the natural acidity we kept by picking early. Coda’s exceptional depth and structure build through the long finish, ending with substantial fine tannins. 38% Cabernet Sauvignon, 33% Cabernet Franc, 20% Merlot, 9% Petit Verdot.” – B. Smith. **New vintage.**

2012 Muga Reserva Red Blend Rioja Spain \$29.99/\$23.39/\$21.05

“A blend of Tempranillo with some 20% Garnacha, 10% Graciano and 5% Mazuelo. 2012 saw good ripeness, and the wine shows it, but doesn’t show any excess. The palate is lush and round, with polished tannins. This is a textbook Rioja at a very good price for the quality it delivers. Drink now through 2022.” –Wine Advocate, 91+ points. **New vintage.**

2013 Jean-Louis Chave Sélection Côtes du Rhône Mon Coeur \$26.99/\$23.39/\$21.05

“A much more accessible path to the heroic king of Hermitage are through the Jean-Louis Chave Sélections, his négociant line which sources grapes from various areas in the northern Rhône. (Mon Coeur Côtes du Rhône is a blend of excellent plots.) As with all things Chave, quality is eminent even at the entry level.” –Winemaker notes. **New vintage.**

2013 Bodegas Juan Gil Aniversario 100 Vintage \$21.99/\$18.69/\$16.82

This is a winner from Juan Gil which pulled out all the stops to commemorate their 100 Year Anniversary with a special cuvée. The goal was to produce a value-priced wine that conveys the soul of the Gil family. This wine is compelling, offering lush fruit flavors with surprising complexity. This blend of 50% Monastrell, 25% Cabernet Sauvignon and 25% Syrah is made in a forward, crowd-pleasing style. **New item. A winner!**

2014 Tamarack Cellars Firehouse Red Columbia Valley \$22.99/\$14.99/\$13.49 Red Blend, \$20 or less.

“Year in and year out, this kitchen-sink blend (in 2014, featuring a full 10 varieties) is among the most complex, delicious reds produced in Washington for less than \$20. The warm 2014 growing season is on fine display here, with ripe, delicious red and black fruits complemented by floral notes and brewed-coffee barrel tones.” -Seattle Magazine August 2016

2014 Nada Giuseppe Nebbiolo Langhe Piemonte \$17.99/\$14.99/\$13.49

Piedmonte is the source for some of the most profound values anywhere in Italy. Nada produces this Nebbiolo within the DOCG zone of Barbaresco, simply labeling it ‘Nebbiolo Langhe’. The wine has a serious structure, tantalizing depth and overall delicacy. The surprise here is that it sells for just about half what your average Barbaresco does. **New vintage.**



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2012 Marques de Caceres Crianza Rioja Spain \$18.99/\$13.09/\$11.78

“Gets better every year confirming its assets, for this wine always delivers. Bouquet of cherries and vanilla with gentle toasted notes. Balanced in the mouth with soft, ripe and luscious tannins that mingle with delicious, lively fruit. Pleasant fullness and good length to delight the palate.”
—Winemaker notes. **New vintage.**

2014 Shenandoah Vineyards “Special Reserve” Zinfandel \$12.99/\$8.39/\$7.55

From the amazing 2014 vintage comes this well focused, medium body Amador Zinfandel with the majority of the grapes coming from our exciting new, sustainably-farmed Jackson Valley estate. This zesty, richly fruited wine is bursting with lush flavors and aromas of black and red fruit that define its appeal. Smooth elegant and inviting. **New vintage.**

White Wines

2015 Cloudy Bay Sauvignon Blanc Marlborough \$28.99/\$25.99/\$23.39

“Impressively intense and focused, with vibrant Meyer lemon notes up front followed by pineapple, green apple skin, dried apricot and green tea details, coming together on the smooth, spicy, juicy finish. Drink now.”
—*Wine Spectator*, 92 points

2015 Lachini Vineyards Pinot Gris Oregon \$23.99/\$19.99/\$17.99

“Aromas of flint, stone, honey and lemon cake leading to a strikingly intense palate accented by caramelized green apple notes. The expressive mid-palate enters with a core of crisp apples and rounds with a velvety mouthfeel of vivacious tropical flavors that intertwine perfectly with the lively acidity. The clean, dry finish concludes with an uplifting texture that lingers and a definitive mineral lift on the finish.” —Winemaker notes. **New vintage.**

2015 Elk Cove Pinot Gris Willamette Valley \$23.99/\$17.79/\$17.79/\$16.01

“Vivid and expansive, with tangy pear and cantaloupe flavors that play against hints of lime, finishing with polish. Smart Buy. Drink now through 2019.”
—*Wine Spectator*, 90 points. **New vintage.**

2015 Cedergreen Cellars Sauvignon Blanc Yakima Valley \$15.99/\$13.09/\$11.78

“100% Sauvignon Blanc. Stainless steel fermentation. Aromatic, rich and opulent. A warm vintage lends its weight toward a blend of tropical flavors with a stone fruit finish. Mango, Meyer lemon and apricot puree. Judkins and Meek Vineyards, Benton City, Yakima Valley.”

2015 Kim Crawford Sauvignon Blanc Marlborough \$27.99/\$14.99/\$13.49

“Spicy honeysuckle notes add dimension to the core of juicy, fleshy apricot, nectarine and passion fruit flavors, with plenty of intensity and spice on the finish. Smart Buy. Drink now.” —*Wine Spectator*, 90 points

2015 Château Petit Roubié Picpoul de Pinet Languedoc \$16.99/\$13.99/\$12.59

“The complex nose combines the dominant aroma of flowers with the scent of white peach and the exotic flavor of pineapples. Initially round and full the taste rapidly changes to lively. The nicely balanced acid-alcohol content brings out the fruity aromas. The long and full after-taste leaves suggestions of citrus and hard fruit.” —Importer notes. **New item.**

2015 Château de la Roche Sauvignon Blanc Touraine Loire Valley \$17.99/\$12.19/\$10.97

The Château de la Roche is one of the oldest single estates of Loire Valley. The vines provide a complex wine on the nose, aromatic and mineral. Ripe fruits and citrus aromas, very subtle and delicate on the palate. **New vintage.**

2015 Villa Wolf Pinot Gris Pfalz Germany \$15.99/\$11.19/\$10.07

Pinot Gris has a very long tradition in the Pfalz region. In fact, it was here that the variety was first identified. Villa Wolf Pinot Gris is made in a full-bodied, dry style with refreshing, unoaked fruit and a crackling texture. Slightly spritz and very pale. Super clean and brisk with some perfume. Good balance. Just a little feather-light softness on the finish. **New vintage.**

Sparkling Wine

Domaine Ste. Michelle Michelle Brut Méthode Champenoise Columbia Valle NV \$23.99/\$11.29/\$9.99 Sparkling Wine of the Year

“A blend of traditional Champagne varieties (Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Pinot Meunier). Aromas combine delicate notes of apple, lemon and white flower, and the palate delights in its fine, persistent mousse.” - *Seattle Magazine* August 2016

Rosé Wine

2015 Renegade Wine Co. Rosé Columbia Valley \$16.99/\$10.59/\$9.53 Rosé of the Year

“This is the second consecutive win in this category for Trey Busch’s Renegade Wine Company, based in the Walla Walla Valley, and it is especially impressive, given it is among the least expensive rosés considered in the category. It’s 80 percent Syrah; the remainder is Cinsault, Cunoise and Grenache. The bone-dry fruit combines cherry and melon, with complexities ranging from mineral notes to green notes (watermelon rind, kiwi).” - *Seattle Magazine* August 2016
